# 2019-2020 City Calendar of Important Dates

*Provides city officials a reference to some of the more significant dates in their business year. Primarily designed for statutory cities but many items also apply to home rule charter cities. Items that apply to statutory cities only are generally designated as such. Other items apply to all cities in most cases.*

## I. Using the calendar

Many items are framed in terms of the last day on which a certain duty must be performed. Calendar users must look ahead and anticipate necessary action since it may be advantageous to complete certain tasks well ahead of the mandated statutory deadlines.

The calendar is not all inclusive, and the possibility for error exists. Use it as a guide and do not rely on it exclusively. Please notify the League's Research Service of any errors or omissions in this publication.

A summary of 2019 legislation affecting cities is available in the League's publication, 2019 Law Summaries. The summary specifies effective dates of new legislation requiring action by cities.

## II. City Elections

Election dates in this calendar are for those statutory cities that have opted for odd-year elections.

Statutory city elections generally occur in November of even numbered years on the same date as the state general election. State law also authorizes statutory cities to choose, by ordinance, to hold their municipal general election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in odd numbered years. The statute does not authorize annual elections, nor does it authorize elections in December or during other times of the year.

Legislation further establishes a uniform date in August for all municipal primaries.

### III. Additional Guidance

If you have any questions about deadlines, please consult the statutes listed on the right side of your calendar or contact the League Research Service.

#### A. Election Administration

City clerks should pay careful attention to the compilation of Minnesota election laws published by the Office of the Secretary of State. Each clerk should have a copy of this publication. If not, contact your county auditor or the Secretary of State's Office.

For city-related questions regarding election laws, or election laws in general, please contact the Secretary of State's Office, your county auditor, or the League Research Department.

#### B. Budget and financial process

City officials involved in the budgeting/finance process may consult the League's Budget Guide for Cities for a more in-depth analysis of deadlines and guidelines pertaining to municipal finance. In order to get budget-affecting information to members more quickly, the Budget Guide now starts out as a webpage updated regularly during the legislative session. Once the session is complete and all information is compiled on the webpage, the Budget Guide will be converted into a memo.

### IV. Calculating dates for action

The League uses the following guidelines to calculate dates in this calendar determining when cities must take action.

#### A. Days before an event

When the statutory reference is to a certain number of days before an election or other event, start counting from the day before the event. When determining the days after the event, start counting from the day after the event. If the "last day" falls on a weekend or legal holiday, that day is usually omitted from computation. This means that if a deadline falls on a Sunday, that day is omitted, and Monday is the deadline day.

**B. Deadlines “on or before” a date**

To ensure that all statutory deadlines are met, the League takes a more conservative approach in guiding cities on deadlines. When a statute requires that action be taken “on or before” a certain date and the date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the calendar uses the previous day (usually a Friday) as the due date.

**C. Action “by” a certain date**

Additionally, if a statute requires that cities take action “by” a certain date or it is otherwise prudent, the League has set the deadline as the day prior in order to ensure that the action is completed when the deadline day begins. Dates computed in this manner are noted with an asterisk (\*).

**D. Submissions to a city**

At the same time, if the statutory deadline is upon a party other than the city to submit an “application, payment, return, claim, statement, or other document” to the city, and the deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, state law allows the party to make the submission to the city the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday.

**E. Weeks before an election**

Finally, when figuring weeks before an election, “one week before” is the same calendar day in the previous week. “One month before” is the same numerical calendar date in the preceding month.

Reminder	<p>At a council meeting, on or before Sept. 30, at which the city council adopts a proposed tax levy and budget, the council must announce which subsequent “regularly scheduled” meetings the budget and tax levy will be discussed. The announcement must include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Date and time of the regularly scheduled meeting at which a final budget and levy will be determined. (Note: meetings must be at or after 6 P.M.)</li> <li>• Public will be allowed to speak at subsequent meetings.</li> </ul> <p>Charter cities must comply with this announcement requirement even if a city charter has provisions to the contrary.</p> <p>This announcement must be included in the minutes and the city must comply with existing publication requirements for minutes.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Special taxing districts (EDAs, HRAs, port authorities, etc.) must adopt and certify any proposed levy by Sept. 30. Like small cities, special taxing districts need not hold public input meetings.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> cities with populations of 500 or less must still certify proposed property tax levies to the county auditor on or before Sept. 30. And small cities must certify the final property tax levy to the county auditor by Dec. 28. If a city misses this deadline, that city’s final levy for the year will stay the same as it was in the previous year.</p>	<p><a href="#">Minn.
